POSSESSIVE PRONOUNS

A **possessive pronoun** shows ownership.
It tells who or what something belongs to.

USED BEFORE A NOUN:

my · your · his · her · its · our · their

USED ON ITS OWN:

mine · yours · his · hers · ours · theirs

Example: June owns the cap.

It is **her** cap.

The cap is **hers**.
