

Subject and Predicate

There are rules every sentence has to follow
You might even call it "sentence etiquette"

is every sentence has to have a subject and a predicate

So what's a subject? I'm glad you asked
How do you find it? Well that's the task
And what's a predicate? Let me explain
There are two parts to a sentence, and these are their names

The subject is who or what the sentence is about (Oh-whoa-oh)
Like in "The cat is fat.", the sentence is about the cat (Oh-whoa-oh)
The predicate is what the sentence says about the subject (Oh-whoa-oh)
And what the sentence says about this particular cat is that it's fat (Oh-whoa-oh)
