That was fun to read But now it's question time What's one thing you can tell me about what giraffes look like?

(Their necks are really long.) Oh, really?

Show me the evidence So you're telling me that giraffes have really long necks Show me the evidence Say, if you don't mind... Where did you find that in the text? Show me the evidence What if I'm skeptical? What if I don't believe you? What should we do? There's an easy way to prove that you're correct Show me the evidence

Where is it? Oh Oh, it's right there. Ok, you're right.

When you sit down and read, you put new information in your brain But when answering questions about what you read, you gotta back up what you say How do I know it's true? And how do you know your memory is right? We gotta look back through the text and find some evidence to verify

If you read a book That was all about bats I might ask you to share with us An interesting fact... (A bat can eat over 1,000 insects in one hour.) Wait, for real?

Show me the evidence So in only one hour, a bat can eat a thousand insects? Show me the evidence Come on, no way, where does it say that in the text? Show me the evidence What if I'm skeptical? What if I don't believe you? What should we do? There's an easy way to prove that you're correct Show me the evidence

Alright, I gotta see this, where does it say that? Oh, wow, ok...woo!

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Show me the evidence So you're telling me that He got it from his best friend Rex? Wait, are you sure? Where did it say that in the text? What if I'm skeptical? What if I don't believe you? What should we do? There's an easy way to prove That you're correct Show me the evidence

(It's right there!) Oh! Yup, you got me. Right again. Of course.
